Government Health IT Office Releases Six Use Cases for Comment

The Office of the National Coordinator for Health IT has released for public comment six prototype use cases that are intended to help it, along with the American Health Information Community, focus standards-harmonization efforts, ensure that standards are on target and establish priorities, *Government Health IT* reports.

The use cases are related to:

- Consultation and transfer of care;
- Immunizations and response management;
- Personalized health care;
- Public health case reporting;
- Remote care consultation; and
- Remote patient monitoring.

The public can comment through Sept. 28 on the use cases. ONCHIT then will expand the prototypes and may modify them in response to the comments, *Government Health IT* reports.

A teleconference is scheduled for Sept. 20 to explain more about the prototype use cases (Ferris, *Government Health IT*, 9/5).

There will be a Stakeholder Teleconference on Thursday, September 20th from 4pm to 5pm EDT. During this teleconference an overview will be held for the prototype use cases that were approved for development during the January 23rd, 2007 AHIC Meeting including: Remote Monitoring, Remote Consultation, Personalized Healthcare, Consultation and Transfers of Care, Public Health Case Reporting, and Immunizations and Response Management.
