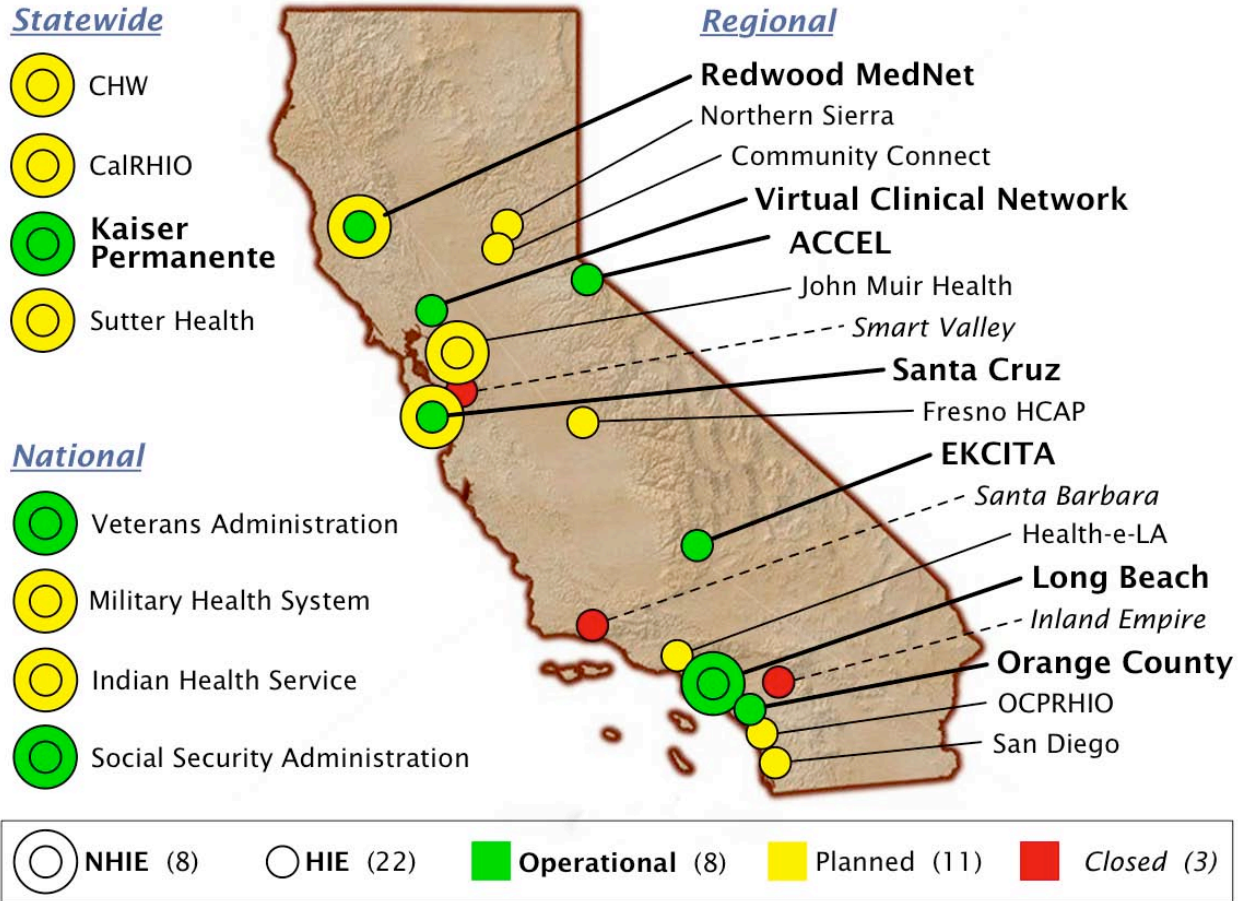


Health Information Exchange Projects in California

NOTES

- This illustration indicates relative readiness to rapidly expand HIE services which conform to federal health IT standards; the illustration does not indicate project scale or potential capacity of HIE project operations
- Regional HIE projects are noted by approximate location on the map of California, while state or national HIE efforts that contain data on California patients are noted off the map
- “Operational” includes HIE projects that operate in a demonstration mode under a test DURSA in order to cleanly distinguish deployed HIE hardware and software from planned HIE deployments. (i.e., to distinguish FY09 HIE expansion prospects from FY10 HIE implementation prospects)
- How to distinguish a Health Information Exchange (HIE) from an enterprise network
 - An HIE has multiple partners from dissimilar environments (i.e., a network effect rather than an enterprise)
 - An HIE tends to be operated by a neutral, non-aligned player
- Enterprise networks that choose to operate an NHIN gateway are included on this map
- Parenthetic counts are California only, and do not include the 4 national gateways
